As we enter the third wave of the Covid pandemic in South Africa and the vaccine role out seems unlikely to reach our staff and families for some time to come, we could be forgiven for feeling a little paralysed. With all the other threatening and scary factors that our media is so good at emphasising in our country and the world, it is sometimes easy to be caught up in this. However, it would be exceedingly irresponsible and indeed, factually biased, to over focus on this negativity when there are so many miracles of hope happening each day in our work.

Our supporters have been amazing at stepping up to the plate for us during this time. Where the economic crisis has predicted many gloomy scenarios, our financial year (28 Feb 2021), managed to end on a small surplus.

Our appeal at the start of Covid to get support for computers and connectivity in all our homes was fully funded and we have recently completed this installation, making a huge impact in supporting our foster families and the crucial education for our children (see detail below).

This year's appeal to secure the funding for all of our 36 foster homes, has seen an excellent response. The majority of our homes are now covered for the 'Loving Family Home programme' for the remainder of this financial year.

Our staff team who have weathered a lengthy and ongoing storm, continue to dig deep, recognising the miracles within our daily work to remain resilient. Here too, new positions that have been granted through additional support have brought great hope to our work.

Our foster families are the greatest source of realising the responsibility and privilege we have in moving forward with hope and courage. COMPUTERS IN EVERY FOSTER HOME

In April 2020, a bold campaign was launched to provide computer connectivity into all 36 of our homes.

This was absolutely crucial to enabling the regular support to the families and allowing the children access to their education during these restricted times.

Our donors responded magnificently! Within a month we were able to start phase one in installing this technology into the seven Khayelitsha homes. Three months later we were supported for the rest of the homes.

Now, one year later, we are so pleased to report that we have completed this installation for all our families. Going forward, no matter how we come out of this pandemic, we could not continue without this development for our families. Having access to knowledge in this way is vital to an equal chance in this world.





